I believe that they key strength in both the tv and radio production was the 'teamwork'. We all respected each other and at all times gave our best effort into the production. We motivated one another and encouraged improvement by explaining to each other how to improve on our individual tasks. There was a positive team spirit where we valued and understood each other's job roles.

One of the weaknesses that was identified was the running order for the tv show which was not accurate and easy to follow during rehearsal productions. Therefore, it caused the

rehearsal production to slow down. I reflected on this and the advice of the director, by reviewing and updating the running order so it flowed more smoothly. When we implemented the updated running order for the final show the production ran a lot more smoothly and to schedule.

4. Were your shows successful? If you were to re-do your shows what changes would you make and why?
