I believe that my pre - production could have been planned a lot better. For example, I decided to do a narrative based music video and do it in the style of an animation. However, it proved to be too difficult and I had to rethink my idea.

I believe I was successful when responding to my research results and meeting audience expectations. To prove this I asked my target audience what they would like to see in my music video. The technical work received the highest responses and I applied this to my production by focusing on camera techniques and post production work.

Another way I proved this was by asking my audience what their favourite jazz song was. Summertime received the highest responses and I decided to do this as my song for my final product.

An area that I felt improved on was directing. When it came to the shooting of my production I clearly understood what I wanted to achieve. I proved this by explaining to my actors and crew what my vision was and breaking it down for them so they understood. I felt I was on a journey of learning in this project. This is because I had to respond very quickly to changing my original idea and adapting to a new idea and reorganising it in a very short time. Whilst I was under pressure I had to stay focused and calm.

One of the weaknesses I identified for this project was my organisation. I originally intended my music video to be an animation and created 115 storyboards for the animation.

I tried to animate it on an internet animation program called Opentoonz. However, it was too difficult as the process of the drawing the animation took longer than I expected. I then reflected on my mistake and rethought of what I wanted to do for my final product.

Another Weakness I identified for this project was my communication with my actors. For example, I didn't give my actress enough detail for the reshoots and this caused her own plans to be disorganised.
